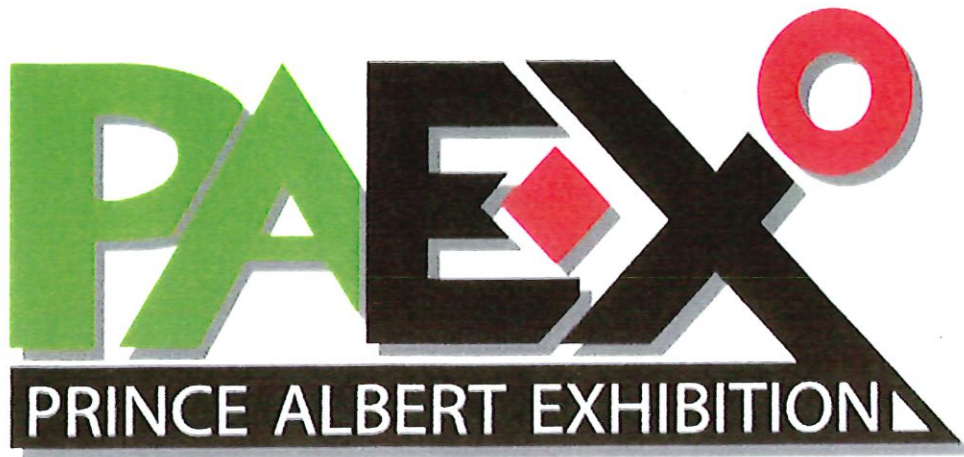

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

General rules, which are applicable, will govern each department. All department or class rules appearing throughout this list take precedence over general rules.

In all cases, the right is reserved to reject entirely, or accept conditionally, any entry or application.

Under no circumstance will exhibits which are offensive (by reason of odor and/or appearances), or those that are dangerous (by reason of combustion and/or explosive character) be permitted. If any such exhibit is introduced, by an exhibitor through misrepresentation or otherwise, they may be removed by order of the Directors.

No claim for injury to any person shall ever be asserted, nor suit instituted or maintained against the Association, its officers, or their agents by or on behalf of any visitors or any person, firm or corporation, or their agents, representatives, servants or employees, having license or privilege to exhibit on the fairgrounds, or occupy any space thereon. If any damage, loss or injury to persons or property shall be proximately caused by reason of neglect or willful act of any person, firm or corporation, their agents, representatives, servants or employees, having license or privilege to exhibit on the fairgrounds, or occupy any space thereon, the Association shall in no manner be responsible therefor, and in case it is subject to any expense or liability, all persons causing the same, or liable therefore, shall indemnify the said Association.

PLEASE READ ALL RULES AND REGULATIONS

TO AVOID DISQUALIFICATION

1. **An exhibitor by making an entry**, by doing so agrees to the rules and regulations printed here on, or afterwards to be made by Directors for the Governance of the Exhibition.
2. **One exhibitor number per exhibitor.** NO fees required for entries, but Exhibition Tags available from Ag/Hort Committee members must accompany all entries.
3. **Prize money** will be available during clean-up on Sunday August 9, from 5:30pm till 7:30pm or in the Exhibition Office following the Exhibition.
4. **Exhibits incorrectly entered** may, at the discretion of the judge or committee in charge, be transferred to the proper classes prior to the judging . If such classes have already been judged, they may not be rejudged.
5. **Exhibits competing for prizes** must be the work of the Exhibitor.
6. **All containers/displays** must be sturdy enough to be moved if required. Any container that falls apart may be disqualified.
7. **Exhibits are to be brought to the Exhibition Centre** during the following times: Tuesday, Aug. 4, 5:00 pm to 9:00 pm and Aug 5, from 8:00 am to 11:00 am.
8. **Judging** will be done prior to the Fair opening. Judges are instructed not to award premiums unless entries are deemed worthy of merit, or to those incorrectly named or listed. No interference with the judges, officers, or helpers in the discharge of their duties will be permitted.
9. **All exhibits must remain on display for the entire Exhibition.** Ag and horticulture exhibits will be released 6:00 pm – 8:00 pm Sunday, August 9. Exhibits not picked up at that time will be available for pick-up on the next regular working day at the Exhibition Office.
10. Every precaution in care and handling of entrees will be taken, but **NO RESPONSIBILITY WILL BE ASSUMED FOR LOST OR DAMAGED GOODS/MATERIALS.**
11. **Articles not picked up** after 30 days will be disposed of unless prior arrangements have been made. Decisions of the respective committees is final.
12. **Best in Show /People's Choice Award** votes will be counted on the final day one hour before clean-up. The winner may claim their prize at the clean-up or arrangements may be made for the winner to receive their prize at a later date .
13. **EXHIBITOR NUMBERS, CLASS NUMBER AND SECTION NUMBERS MUST BE ON EACH ENTRY TAG OR THE ENTRY MAY NOT BE JUDGED**

Rules and Regulations

1. Entry tags and exhibitor numbers are free, but must be from the Exhibition for the current year.
2. There is no charge to exhibitors. To enter, exhibitors may collect ENTRY TAGS and an EXHIBITOR NUMBER the week before the Exhibition from the Exhibition office, or collect entry tags and an exhibitor number from an Exhibition Ag/Hort Committee member when bringing items to be entered.
3. Exhibitors must fill out their own tags and bring tagged entries to Exhibition Building.
4. The Exhibitor Number must be on each entry tag.
5. Only one exhibitor number per exhibitor is allowed. (1 Exhibitor Name = 1 Number)
6. It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to add the name and variety on the entry tag as well as their exhibitor number before placing the tag on the exhibit. Points will be deducted on all entries not named and **exhibits with no exhibitor number may not be judged.**
7. Aggregate Points (Boxed Specials) will be awarded:
1st – 3 points, 2nd – 2 points, 3rd – 1 point.
8. Exhibition Hall will be open to receive exhibits between 5:00 pm and 9:00 pm on Tuesday Aug 4, and between 8:00 am and 11:00 am Wednesday Aug 5. All entries must be ready to be judged by 11:00 am, Wednesday Aug 5.
9. Articles may be picked up from 6:00 pm till 8:00 pm, Sunday August 9.
10. Please make note of rules under each section.
11. Please read all rules and category descriptions with care!
12. Exhibitors may vote once only for People's Choice/Best in Show Award!

VEGETABLES

The committee in charge will have the authority to place exhibits in the proper classes. Exhibitors may make any number of entries in the vegetable classes, provided the exhibits are separate, named varieties. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to add the name of the variety and their exhibitor number is on the entry tag before being placed on the exhibit.

NOTE:

1. Onions must be cleaned but not skinned, tops must be folded over, tied and trimmed off. The roots should be trimmed to a uniform length, but not totally removed.
2. Rhubarb leaves must be trimmed to leave a 1" fan and bottoms must be cleaned but intact.
3. Potatoes may be cleaned.
4. Entries should be fairly uniform in size and shape.
5. All entries should be exhibited on plates provided.

4. Some vegetables will be judged by length and some by weight as indicated in the prize book.
5. Beets, carrots and onions must have an inch of top present, but length will be measured from the shoulder to the tip.
6. All vegetables shown must be cleaned and roots trimmed if applicable.
7. All vegetables will be shown on plates supplied by the PAEX.
8. All entries will be judged by the show committee.
